### **ABOUT THE NOVEL**

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO ROSEMARIE? is a novel based on a true story by author Vera Christa Doederlein Hastie, with an afterword by Christa Hastie, and includes 50+ never-seen-before photos. The book is set to launch on May 19th for sale worldwide.

At the end of 1954, just a handful of weeks after emigrating from a small village in Germany to Montreal Canada, Rosemarie Döderlein just turned 14 years old when she vanished on the way to a bakery a few doors down from the family apartment, never to be seen or heard from again.

After 68 years of fruitless searching and wondering, in 2022, Rosemarie's youngest sister Vera finally learned the truth of what happened to her. It is a remarkable story about unconditional love, DNA, and investigative genetic genealogy.

Reporting on the story and the details of Vera's final search made the covers of Reader's Digest Canada, Reader's Digest UK, and in Reader's Digest Germany, at the end of 2023.

Vera's novel tells the story of her family's life in Germany: the impact of war, the hope for a better life in Canada, the crushing reality of a tragic loss, and how it is that a family moves forward afterward. Publishing this novel represents the final act of closure on this lifelong arc.

Vera Christa Doederlein Hastie is excited to release her first novel, WHATEVER HAPPENED TO ROSEMARIE? A NOVEL BASED ON A TRUE STORY on May 19, 2024.

The novel is a mixed genre of historical fiction, memoir and true crime. Paperback, hardcover, and eBooks will be available in both English and German language versions, and a 12 hour 21 minute audiobook version of the novel, narrated by storyteller Dick Wilson, is available for those who prefer to hear the novel.

After 70 years, the fate of Rosemarie Döderlein is at last known.

Vera is 81 years of age and is "proud as a peacock" to have published this one novel in her lifetime that she considers an honor to her entire family. She is grateful to have been a recipient of the UCLA Extension Writers' Program Scholarship in 2015, which helped jumpstart the writing of this

novel. In Vera's younger years, she worked as an executive secretary in Southern California. She was married to her late husband for almost 20 years, is the mother to two children, and "Oma" (grandmother) to four grandchildren. She enjoys movies, cooking, gardening, sewing, knitting, and crossword puzzles in her free time.

  Silence is a song that helped her sit with her loneliness, heartbreak,
  and loss. The lyrics hold a profound meaning for her.
